



What makes a good...
Clinician



Qualities and credentials



Must have clinical knowledge relevant to the person at the centre of the review.



Has experience of supporting people outside of hospitals.



Is challenging to authority – not accepting of status quo and rigorous in checking the formulation.



Actions



Declares any relationship with the setting within the last five years



Requests notes at the beginning of the day – a minimum list as per details in the Gold Standard for 'before' and 'during' a Care and Treatment Review.



Identifies any other evidence needed throughout the day.



Makes sure the essential clinical question list is fulfilled.



Actions



Scrutinises the medication records, PRN use, alongside finding out why and when and ABC of PRN use and how medication effectiveness is being monitored.
